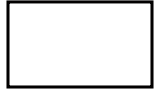

1. Current rule you would like to change: Wild Steelhead Retention Rule

- 2. Your proposed rule:
a. Species affected: Wild steelhead
b. Geographic areas affected: Statewide
c. Time of year in effect: Year round
d. Other details: No wild steelhead may be retained at any time. No exceptions.

3. Why this change is needed: Wild steelhead throughout their range are either listed, depleted or in decline. Of the seven ESUs in Washington, 5 are now listed as threatened or endangered. Of more 100 streams producing harvests in the 1950's, only 10 to 12 each year now remain open to harvest due to depletion or listing. Our organization recommends the state manage in a more conservation manner that will help prevent further depletion of the species and help rebuild the runs to the higher levels that have been recorded in recent history.

Instructions

 2. **Your proposed rule:** describe the rule change you are proposing, being sure to include the details listed in parts a-d.

 - d. Other details - Anything else you want to include such as gear type, daily limit, etc.

Sample Proposal

1. **Current rule you would like to change:**

Sample Lake is currently open to fishing for game fish from the last Saturday in April through October 31, with statewide size and daily limit.
 2. **Your proposed rule:** Sample Lake should have a year-round season.
 - a. Species affected – All Game Fish
 - b. Geographical area affected – Sample Lake, Sample County
 - c. Time of year in effect – Year-round
 - d. Other details – Size and bag limits would remain unchanged.
 3. **Why this change is needed** – Trout are no longer planted in Sample Lake, so there is no reason to restrict the opening time.
 4. **Public or Agency Involvement:**
 - a. Names of individuals or groups with whom you have discussed this change:
Sample County Poggie Club, Enforcement Personnel in Sample County (etc.)
